



TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF RENTING A LITTER KIT

Valued Volunteer,

We appreciate your drive to reduce litter. You are awesome! We do request that you agree to our terms and conditions of returning our equipment and cleaning up your area safely. By check the "acceptance box" on the Rent-A-Litter Kit form, you are agreeing to the terms and conditions of volunteering with and renting a litter kit from Keep Lincoln County Beautiful. The details of the terms and conditions are found below:

If you borrow any of the following, we ask that you return it within 2 weeks (maximum, unless discussed with Executive Director) of your clean up so that we may sanitize it and rent it out to another volunteer:

- Litter Picker(s)
- Trash bags
- Safety Vest(s)
- Hand Sanitizer Bottle
- Any unused materials

It is required for interested individuals to watch the NCDOT Litter Pickup Safety Video and review the Safety Guidelines. This information is found at <https://www.ncdot.gov/initiative-policies/environmental/adoptahighway/Pages/safety-guidelines.aspx>.

It is required for all interested individuals to review the Volunteer Waiver and Release Form and submit the Volunteer Consent Form at <https://www.klcbnc.org/join-the-mission> prior to conducting any cleanups. All volunteers understand that Keep Lincoln County Beautiful and involved members are free of any and all liability of incidents that may occur during litter pickups, or during any volunteer opportunities and events. Parents and guardians accept responsibility and liability for any participating minors. Volunteers must understand that no minor under the age of 12 can participate in roadside litter pickups, per the NCDOT, for safety reasons.

Volunteers agree to fill out the collection data sheet to the best of their ability and return it to Keep Lincoln County Beautiful when equipment is returned, or email the information to klcbnc@gmail.com. Additionally, if the volunteer(s) picking up roadside litter utilizes any NCDOT bags that require pickup by NCDOT, the volunteer agrees to report the location and quantity of bags no more than 12 hours following the end of their litter pickup event.

Volunteers are responsible for disposing of their own litter collected, unless otherwise coordinated with NCDOT.
